
This is a rather large issue with lots of info, so I'll keep my mouth shut so you can enjoy it all! Until next time, y safe!



Safety &

Training

participate on any Saturday.

The way we keep our field and are able to enjoy our hobby is by keeping it safe. Don't take it personally when someone reminds you of a safer way of operating. Everyone should be concerned about safety. As long as all of us practice safety, we will not have to adopt more rules. Rules happen when it is obvious that not everyone understands what is safe and what is not. There have been a few incidents that make it obvious why it is necessary to secure your plane at all times while it is running in the startup area. Remember that your plane needs to be held at all times or should be tied down. Secure the plane ESPECIALLY when you go to grab the transmitter. Once your plane is untied, you must hold it until you are out of the startup area. There is absolutely no taxiing in the startup area. Walk your plane out to the taxiway.

All regular ying must be done from the runway out to our ight boundaries. This is our designated ying area. The ONLY exception is helicopters hovering low and slow in the designated grassy area. This is to protect people on the ight line. It means no ying high over the grass. Then, when transitioning your helicopter from hover to forward ight, you must move into the regular ying areas. Do not y any planes over the grassy area, also known as the red zone.

The AMA is always making new rules. When you received your AMA card this year you may have noticed a few new rules listed. Always read them. The last one on my renewal stated; "Under no circumstances may a pilot or other person touch a powered model in ight; nor should any part of the model other than the landing gear, intentionally touch the ground, except while landing". Just remember to be very careful around running engines or ying planes. The AMA will not accept liability if safety rules are violated. The AMA rules begin with; "I understand that my failure to comply with the Safety Code may endanger my insurance coverage".

Finally, be sure to put the AMA required I.D. on your plane; name, phone number and AMA number. It is a good idea to put the I.D. on the outside of the plane where it is more visible. Also put your name and phone number on your transmitter so we can call you when you leave your transmitter at the field.







From Hwy 101 heading North:

Exit on Cochrane Road heading west. Proceed to Monterey Hwy (approx 0.6 of a mile). Turn right on Monterey Hwy and head north for appoximately 2.6 miles. Just after you pass Live Oak, you'll see some high tension power lines and an 8 x 10 sign for the SCCMAS. Turn right at the power lines and proceed straight down the paved, private road to enter the SCCMAS. Speed limit is 15 mph.

From Hwy 101 or 85 heading South:

Exit on Bernal Avenue heading west. Proceed to Monterey Hwy (approx 0.5 of a mile). Turn left on Monterey Hwy heading south. Proceed south for approx 6 miles until you reach Live Oak Avenue. You must make a turnaround on Live Oak Ave. U-turns are not permitted at this intersection on Monterey Hwy. You should be heading North on Monterey Hwy now. Turn right at the high tension power lines where you see an 8 x 10 sign for the SCCMAS. Proceed straight down the paved, private road to enter the SCCMAS. Speed limit is 15 mph.



Please note-While on the private entrance road, use caution and obey the 15 mph speed limit. Stop at all stop signs and yield the right of way when a bicyclist is present! Thanks, the SCCMAS.






