What's this, an Airplane Gyro

Well, I purchased one JR G370A airplane gyro for around \$160. Af-

ter installing it in my UCanDo in line with the rudder leads, I make the following observations:

- Surprise, it only works with digital servos. Nothing said about this in the original technical description that I remember. Had to swap out a servo.
- 2. It really does matter which orientation you use for mounting the gyro.
- One spare radio channel needed for gyro gain control. If I had used two gyros, i.e., elevator and rudder, I would have needed two different gain channels. Oops, my Futaba T7C only had one unused channel, therefore I can only use one gyro on the UCanDo.
- 4. I've started to think about buying a Hitec Aurora 9 channel radio.

- 5. With the gyro and its cabling, things are looking a little busy inside my UCanDo fuselage.
- 6. Suggestion to Futaba, JR, and Hitec: Put the gyro(s) inside the receiver.

Field Safety Chairman By Tim Stahlke

Greetings fellow SCCMAS Pilots. For those who don't know me, I'm Tim Stahlke, and I've recently accepted the position of Safety Officer. I'm not a high time pilot, only became active with the club in 2008, and was signed off by Tim Jones that same year flying my .60 size P-51 Marie electric mustang. Tim instilled in me an important safeguard about communication on the flight line!! COMMUNICATE your intentions- you cannot be too loud out on the flight line. TALK IT UP- let the other pilots know your intentions. (Low pass, touch-n-Go, Landing Full Stop!!) Having recently graduated to larger ¼ scale gas aircraft, it really hits home now what Tim taught me about communication on the flight line that day.

So, I was surprised and honored when Michael asked if I would consider being the SCCMAS safety officer, and it really got me thinking. I've broken some safety rules since joining SCCMAS. Like many of us, it's usually because I'm excited to get out there and get my plane in the air. I'm rushing and end up cutting corners- yes SAFETY corners. SLOW down I've been told by those annoying members who never cut themselves with their prop. You'll get your flights in. Simply slowing down can lend itself to safety. Some members will even remember one particular day

when I was in a rush. I cut myself through my shirt as the prop on my .40 size P-51 accidently started when I bumped the throttle stick while carrying an armed electric warbird to the "real" run-up area!!

We really have an awesome flying site. Our club is filled with many experienced, seasoned members that are more than happy to help newer folks out. That said, in seeking advice about my new role by talking with some of the "at Large" board members who shall remain nameless (Don C. and Tim J.) I was reminded of an important aspect of our clubs overall safety. I'm only riding in the safety posse with-ALL OF YOU fellow pilots. we are all SAFETY deputies!! Each of us should be aware and observe anytime we're around a spinning propeller, of our plane or anyone else's, regardless of the power source. Our club layout is no mystery and lends itself to a safe flying environment.

I look forward to meeting and flying with all of you, and welcome your suggestions and observations about safety at SCCMAS.

You should be receiving your AMA renewal notice in the mail any day now. I have already renewed mine by going here - https://www.modelaircraft.org/joinrenew.aspx - to renew online. You can use a credit card or PayPal to save time and postage. Then, when you get your renewal package from The Tomcats, you've got a major step already taken care of.
