

# Contest Aems



With the New Year just around the corner, it's time to briefly reflect on 2012. Looking back, the 2012 events were some of the best attended in the last five years. The largest of which, were the three swap meets. The popularity of the swap meet has increased, attracting buyers and sellers from as far away as Los Angeles and Redding. Most attendees tell us that we host one of the best swap meets in the area, and ask when the next one is scheduled. Both the Heli Jamboree and the T-34 races were also popular, attracting pilots from all over California. Of course the Annual Airshow in July topped the charts. We certainly set a new high. I want to thank those members that have stepped up this year, donating their time and energy to make the events a success.

The timing of some events at the SCCMAS crossed with last few newsletters. And the same holds true for this newsletter. The annual Toys-For-Tots on Sunday December 2nd will cross. Rain or shine, every year the SCCMAS receives overwhelming support from its members at the Toys-For-Tots Breakfast/Fly-In, as we help less fortunate children in the community during the holiday season. This is one of many times during the year that the

SCCMAS gives back to the community, and it is recognized.

A reminder that January 1st 2013 is around the corner. Make sure you have renewed your AMA membership and have sent in your SCCMAS renewal for 2013. It is required that all members flying at the SCCMAS facility starting January 1st 2013 MUST have a 2013 AMA card. There are no exceptions to this rule! If you have sent in your AMA card renewal and have not received your AMA card by January 1st 2013, you can go to the AMA website to verify your AMA membership status. If the AMA status is a "waiting for payment to clear" type of message, then you are not a current 2013 AMA member and cannot fly at the SCCMAS facility until your AMA status has changed to a valid AMA membership status for 2013.

A preliminary 2013 event calendar is complete, pending a few potential date adjustments. The schedule will be finalized by January and published on both the SCCMAS website and the NCRCS website. A few changes that remain from last years' schedule, the Heli Jamboree in May, Warbird Fly-In at the end of June and the annual Fun-Fly in September. Two T-34/Unlimited Warbird racing events are part of the schedule. Kevin Norred has already started coordinating the 2013 race dates with other clubs around the area.

Over the last several years the SCCMAS has participated in many public events, exposing the public to the R/C hobby and the SCCMAS. As in the past at these public events, we have an overwhelming amount of club members volunteering. I would like to thank all of the members who volunteered in 2012 making these public events a success. Because of this, the SCCMAS has been asked to participate at several Airport Fly-Ins around the Santa Clara valley in 2013. Including the San Martin Wings of History Fly-In on May 18th, the Reid Hillview Airport day in June (date TBD) and the Hollister Airshow in August (date TBD). A quick recap since the last newsletter. This year we moved the Fly-Fly to September 22nd hoping to attract a larger attendance. And it worked. The group had a lot of fun trying their hand at different piloting drills. Some pilots found out that strings, balloons and gravity sometimes work against a plane in flight. Even Tim Jones demonstrated the proper technique required to remove wings from his own airplane while flying it. On October 5th, the races returned. This was the final race of the season. Pilots raced both T-34 Bronze and Gold classes and the unlimited warbird class for the top five trophy points of the year, for each of the classes. On Saturday November 3rd, the SCCMAS hosted the fall R/C swap meet. When I arrived at 6:00 am darkness, the early bargain hunters were already wandering the parking lot with flashlights in hand as cars arrived. By mid-morning the pit area was packed with bargains hunters and sellers. If you missed this one, the next R/C swap meet will be in April 2013.
